Reminiscent of Brazil's black history

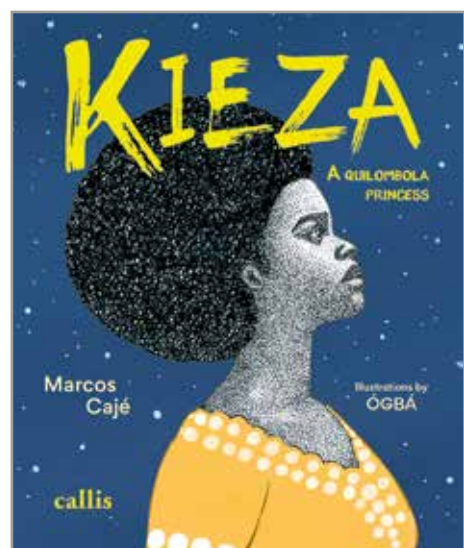

In this story, they build a Quilombo, a settlement and new home, which is soon destroyed by the Brazilian state authorities.

But even with a failed project, Kieza and her partner Manoel are still full of strength and pride and proclaim: "Long live our ancestors! Long live the black people!"

The author Marcos Cajé is passionate about exploring the experiences of Black people. For his children's books celebrating Black culture in Brazil, he coined the term "Afrofantastic Literature."

The book's illustrator, Ógbá, is a graffiti artist whose work highlights Black ancestry and everyday life in São Paulo. His striking black-and-white illustrations perfectly complement Marcos Cajé's poetic storytelling.

In reality, parents enjoy having a life beyond family, and children love going to kindergarten and playing together with their friends. It is important to invite children to imagine their parents' lives beyond themselves and help parents to overcome the feelings of guilt because they "abandon" their children at school.

The child psychologist Claudia Souza has drawn an antithesis to this traditional concept. Together with the cheerful and colorful illustrations by Sandra Lavandeira, her story tells of the diversity and joy of contemporary families.
