
This answer belongs to a traditional way of education: Children MUST go to kindergarten because their parent MUST work, otherwise they would stay at home together.

The end of the text closes the circle of the temporary separation and offers security to the children and the parents.



Both work together in the field, the peasant sells the harvest and can manage to keep his money save.

Both text and illustrations are inspired by "literatura de Cordel", a traditional literary genre from the Brazilian Northeast, printed booklets containing folk novels, but also texts on historical, political or educational topics, illustrated with woodcuts.

The colorfully illustrated apologue on Tibur and his master can inspire young kids to think about values, as respect and friendship, reflecting on our actions before making dificult decisions which we may regret in the future, perceiving differences not as conflict, but as diversity and opportunity of growth.




